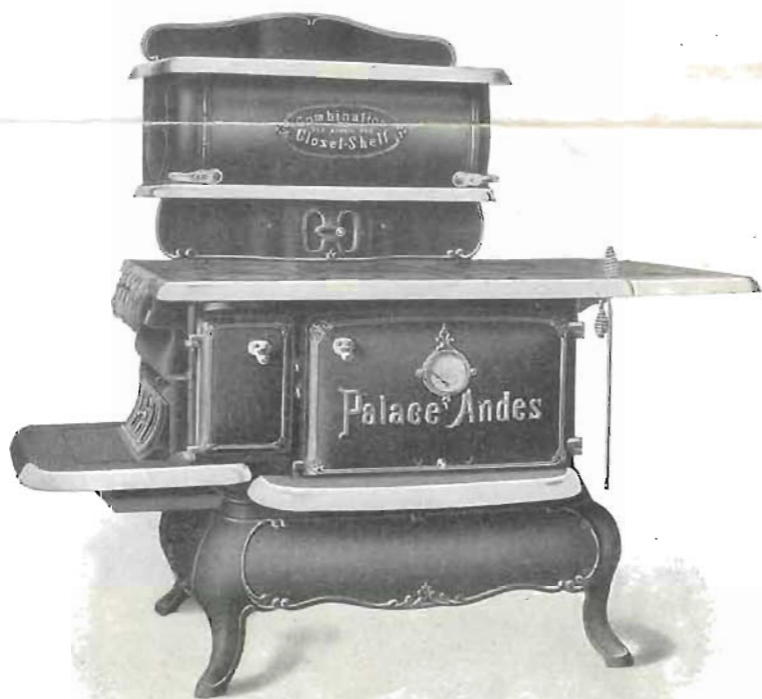

The flues are in perfect proportion

to carry the products of combustion for heating the oven and for economy. The plated trimmings, the bands, and its entire appointments are strictly up-to-date and in advance of most other stoves.

THE PALACE ANDES RANGE

The Palace Andes as a Gas Range

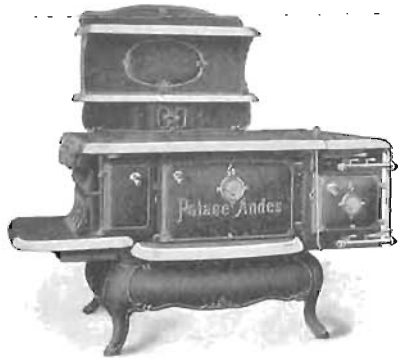
THIS range is made with either a gas-attachment, so called, or what is termed a gas-plate, either of which can be used in place of the reservoir, being in the same location on the range.

The **GAS-ATTACHMENT**, as herein shown, has a good-sized oven with oven indicator, a broiler immediately over the oven, and three cooking-holes on top. This arrangement has been thoroughly tested, and if properly handled will give most satisfactory results. Perfect baking can be done, broiling entirely satisfactory, and of course the three holes on top can be used, one or all of them, as desired.

It is essential that a tight pipe be attached to the collar at the rear of the gas-baking oven to the smoke-pipe, with a tight damper in same, which should be closed when not using the gas-attachment, but should be open when the gas-oven or broiler is used.

The **GAS-PLATE** is simply three gas cooking-holes on a plane with the top, which will be found very satisfactory if properly handled.

In the use of either of the above arrangements for gas, great care should be used to have the air regulators properly adjusted so that the proper amount of air will be introduced to mix with the gas to give the best results, as in either manufactured or natural gas, no two gases are of the same quality or of the same pressure. We cannot make this too emphatic. We repeat that if it is properly used and the gas properly handled in regard to lighting and shutting off and on at the proper time, perfect satisfaction will be secured; otherwise it will not be satisfactory.

THE PALACE ANDES RANGE

TO undertake to describe the **PALACE ANDES RANGE** and all its peculiar features is very difficult in so brief a paper as this circular. The several cuts on this sheet show not only the exterior of this new, excellent and attractive range, but also some interior views, from which a very fair idea can be drawn of the many features which go to make up in its entirety this excellent range.



Cut No. 1

The fire-box and large broiler-door opening as shown very plainly in Cut No. 1, are features peculiar to **ANDES RANGES**. The fire-box is free and clear, with round corners and almost straight sides, making the best possible form for burning any kind of fuel. The broiler-door as shown in the same cut drops free and clear of the opening and is a very nice improvement.

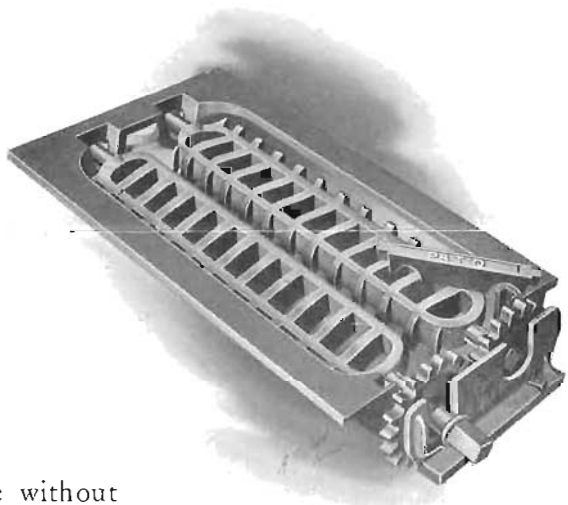
THE PALACE ANDES RANGE

IN cut No. 2 is shown a portion of the fire-box when fitted for burning wood; also the inside drop-door. This door arrangement is peculiar, as it forms a good shelf to rest the wood on momentarily, and also keeps the ashes within the fire-box instead of allowing them to fall out against the door.

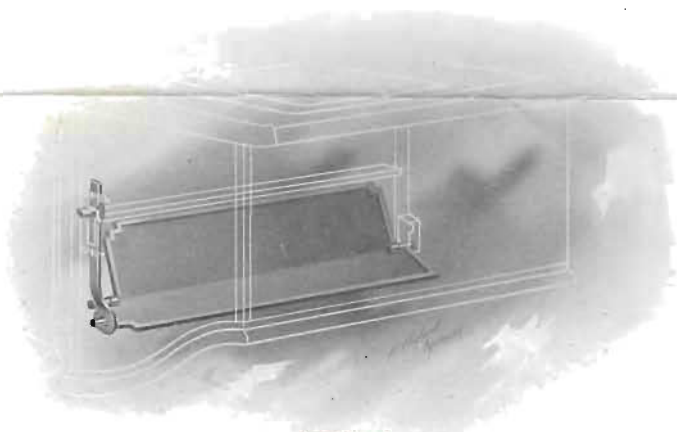
as illustrated in Cut No. 3 is made only in **ANDES RANGES**. It can be repaired with less trouble than any other construction, having no bolts whatever to remove to repair either the grate or gearing, and the entire construction can be removed from the stove without disturbing any part of the fire-box linings.

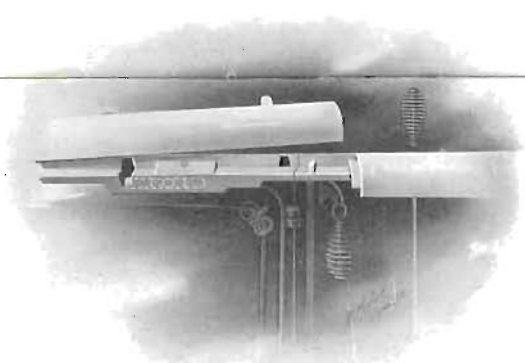
THE PALACE ANDES RANGE

CUT No. 4 shows the very practical reservoir damper as used in **ANDES RANGES**. This damper can be removed and repaired with the least possible trouble—no bolts whatever to be handled. This is considered the best construction for this purpose ever used.

In Cut No. 5 is shown the peculiar manner of securing to place the loose bands used on these ranges. A loose band on a range, unless it is securely fastened in some way, is positively objectionable, but on **ANDES RANGES** there is a very simple arrangement of slide beneath the top which secures the band to the top, making it as rigid and tight as though it were bolted.

THE PALACE ANDES RANGE

IN Cut No. 6 is shown what has been named the "ANDES COMBINATION CLOSET-SHELF," an entirely new and original arrangement for a warming closet. As the cut plainly shows it is just above the T rail and beneath the high shelf, utilizing this space for this purpose, which has never heretofore been used. It will at once be seen that it serves a double purpose, both as a large additional shelf besides the regular high shelf space, and when desired by closing the door gives a very roomy warming closet in a much more accessible position than the common so-styled high closet. This feature makes the **PALACE ANDES RANGE** more desirable and practical, having advantages no other range possesses. The practical buyer of a range will serve his best interest if he investigates thoroughly the merits of the **PALACE ANDES** as compared with any other, and will make no mistake if he purchases one. It is perfectly made in all its parts; of most perfect castings and finish, and of a very attractive design.
