



## THE QUEEN ATLANTIC RANGE

If you have always wanted a cooking range like the one your great-grandmother used to have, don't spend time and money hunting for an antique. The Queen Atlantic is probably what you have in mind, and you can buy a brand-new one made in the original foundry from the original patterns—and this is not a reproduction, it is the real thing. The Portland Stove Foundry in Portland, Maine, has been in business since 1877, and this particular range—the Queen Atlantic—has been in continuous production since 1906.

It is built today, as it always has been, of solid cast iron. The outside is available either in natural cast iron, or in an attractive range of colors in porcelain enamel.

The range comes a number of different ways—with or without a warming oven, with or without a water reservoir, and so on. The photograph shows it with a high warming shelf on top; to the right, under an extension of the cooktop, is the water reservoir; to the left of the reservoir is the oven door (with thermometer); to the left of that, the firebox door; and extending out from the left side, a hearth shelf.

The oven with oven thermometer is enormous, designed for the holiday family gatherings come to feast on Grandma's famous cooking. The oven control damper is on top, and the cookstove surface, with removable stove lids, is more than generous.

An extra large and deep firebox holds a large load of fuel and is accompanied by an extra-deep ash pit to minimize work. There is a special flue construction designed for great fuel economy.

In spite of its undoubted appeal as a reminder of the good old days, the Queen Atlantic is an immensely practical range—designed in a no-nonsense way to do the job it is meant for. If its size precludes

its use in the modern kitchen, a smaller version—with the same size oven and optional features—is available.
